What is happening in Hungary?

On 7th March the Hungarian parliament reinstated a law that requires all asylum seekers to be detained immediately upon entry and held in camps while their claims are considered. The move has been criticised by human rights organisations.

UNHCR

The United Nation's High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR) has also been monitoring this situation, and has responded to recent events.

UNHCR is deeply concerned at a new law which has been voted this morning at the Hungarian Parliament and which foresees the mandatory detention of all asylum seekers, including many children, for the entire length of the asylum procedure.

In practice, it means that every asylum-seeker, including children, will be detained in shipping containers surrounded by high razor wire fence at the border for extended periods of time. ... Alternatives to detention should always to be considered first. Failure to do so could render detention arbitrary Children should never be detained under any conditions as detention is never in a child's best interest.
