Before you begin you might like to gather the following items:-

- A candle to light.
- A pair of Scissors
- Blue material
- Butterfly template separate email.
- Journal & pen

Opening Prayer

Celebrated artist PJ Crook spent 15 years creating an altarpiece for her church. And when she was painting Mary, she felt a real sense of divine inspiration.



In the image, the young Mary gazes into the future. Around her head is a circle of butterflies, symbol of Resurrection, whilst the caterpillar in the above image makes its way along the rail at the bottom. The infant Christ reaches up towards the Dove, symbol of the Holy Spirit and more latterly of peace.



Why the Small Blue butterfly?

About 3 years ago I heard about the very beautiful Small Blue as having been reintroduced in the North Ayrshire area.

It is the UK's smallest butterfly and became extinct in south west Scotland in the early 1980s. In 2007 it was added to the UK Biological Action Plan (BAP) species list after suffering a significant decline in distribution as its small size makes it particularly vulnerable to local climatic and habitat changes.

Small Blue colonies in Scotland are now mostly found on sand dunes and other coastal grasslands, with only two or three inland sites remaining. So it is vitally important to maintain their habitat in as good a condition as possible.

In 2013 the butterfly was re-introduced at Gailes Marsh nature reserve near Irvine, Ayrshire .The Scottish Wildlife Trust continues to lead this work, in conjunction with Dundonald Links, to expand its habitat in the hope that it will survive in Scotland.

In Scotland, adults can be on the wing from late May/early June through to July, depending on weather conditions. A small second brood may be seen in August/September in exceptional years.

I like the idea that it is small and might be thought of as insignificant yet it has an important job as a pollinator. It is such a gift that the efforts of some committed individuals' actions have resulted in us being able to enjoy its presence here on earth.

<u>Meditation Activity – Everywhere there is Hope.</u>

You are now invited to use the attached template and your fabric to cut out a blue butterfly which you can decorate/personalise to be included in a Loving Earth textile panel. Alternatively you can knit or crotchet a butterfly using one of the templates as a guide for the approximate size to make. NB the panel is 30cm by 30cm so is quite small.

I have already started making the panel as a way of engaging positively and creatively with environmental issues for the love of creation. I would love to include your butterfly on this panel.

It is anticipated on completion it would be our group panel and will be included in an exhibition for COP26 in Glasgow due to take place in November this year. I have started this and would like to incorporate your butterflies in it.

What action, if any, are you being drawn to consider taking?

You may like to take 5 minutes to note down some of your thoughts and feelings, create a simple prayer or write down a new commitment that you could share & send via email with our group.
