
## Refugees

# Calais

Calais, more than 600 refugees sleeping rough.

The informal refugee camp "the jungle" of Calais might have been demolished just one year ago, but today more than 600 refugees survive in the outdoors of Calais and in the surrounding grasslands.

The current situation is harder and worse than it was in the camp which had at least a minimal infrastructure to offer some protection from winter cold and rain.

Today refugees undergo daily harassment by police and have no place to sleep or live.

Material needs today: winter sleeping bags, men's outdoor shoes and socks (39-42), easy tents, plastic ponchos, gloves, hats, scarfs. New underwear for young men, T-Shirts, jeans or joggers - all only small & medium please! See our website www.mariaskobtsova.org for a detailed list.
